Thank you to all of the Friends of Union County Library for your continued support. The library has been growing by leaps and bounds for the last few years and the demand for more services has grown as well. FOUCL has helped us fulfill many of those demands with monetary as well as volunteer support.

Union County Public Library went wireless on Saturday, July 22nd! We have had very few glitches and patrons seem be enjoying it a great deal. The donation that FOUCL made toward the purchase of software and hardware is greatly appreciated.

The Mountain Regional Library Board of Trustees voted on and adopted a new Safe Child & Dependant Adult Policy on August 4th for each of the four libraries in the Mountain Regional Library System. This new policy can be found posted throughout the library or on our library website:

Union County Public Library, as well as 251 other libraries in the state of Georgia, went live with the debut of a new circulation and cataloging software called EVERGREEN on September 5th. Not only did circulation change dramatically for library staff, patrons now have

access to a new Web-based PINES catalog featuring book covers, reviews, tables of contents and a variety of easy-to-



use searches that will allow library users to locate materials quickly and efficiently throughout the system. Although the first week was a test of patience for both the staff and patrons, most of the initial problems have been resolved and the system seems to be running smoothly. The Web address to access the Pines online catalog changed with the cross-over to this new improved system. The new address is:

To access your online account you will need your library card number and your four digit password that was given to you when you registered for your library card. If you no longer have your four digit password please stop by the library and receive a password.
