Friends Help Close State Funding Gap

Thank you to all the Friends of Union County Public Library for your continued support. In August and September, the library renewed several magazine and newspaper subscriptions with some of the money that the Friends gave to the library in August. The rest of the money was used to purchase books. The library will be receiving no state money for materials this year and will have to rely on local library funding for book purchasing. Money that the Friends donate to the library throughout the year will help lessen that burden a great deal.

Expansion and renovation on the library began on October 11th. Winter Construction has done extensive demolition and has begun preparing the back of the building for expansion.

As you know, the library moved to a temporary location at 178 Bracketts Way in 2009 November because of growing leaks and issues with plumbing. All of the

damaged, moldy ceiling tiles and drywall have been removed from the building.

The upcoming year will be an exciting time for the library. We should see a lot of progress in the next few months. The project should be finished by late spring and we look forward to celebrating with our grand opening.
