

Message from the President: IT'S BEEN A VERY GOOD YEAR !

2011 has seen Friends accomplishing much, celebrating greatly, and anticipating events to round out the year with gusto! Friends have been volunteering under the capable leadership of Fund-raising Chairman **Joanne Olson** to raise an unprecedented amount in anticipation of the re-opening of our beautiful new Library last summer.

Together with **Barbara Hale**, who co-chaired a most successful Trash & Treasures Fund-raiser with Joanne, we saw a long line of attendees standing in line for fifteen minutes before the doors even opened!

Joanne pieced a beautiful quilt and asked several artisans if they would donate their services to create a memorable Raffle. The long-arm quilting was done by **Darlene & Bill Barnes of Appalachian Quilting Company** in Hiawassee; **Diane Simonsen**, a master basket-maker, provided a large basket lined in the same fabric as the quilt; and woodworker, **Edwin Panter**, crafted an exquisite walnut jewelry box to bring the Raffle items up to an awesome Three Wondrous Prizes for one lucky winner.

The Triple-Header Raffle items were brought to the Butternut Creek Festival, the Green Bean Festival, and the Sorghum Festival, as well as being displayed at United Community Bank—all of which contributed to the largest number of raffle tickets ever sold for FOUCL, the net of which totaled over \$2,500. What an outstanding testament to the cooperation involved in raising funds for the library! The winning ticket was drawn at the October meeting of FOUCL by **Connie Wiegman**, Judy Vaughn's sister-in-law who was visiting from Jacksonville, FL. Excitement was raised to a fever pitch as the winner was announced: **Jimmy and Casey Pruett** of Eastman, Georgia. Congratulations!



Suffice to say, without the willing hearts and hands of Friends, none of this could have been accomplished. It is a testimony to the cooperative spirit that says Each One Can Do Something. Some of our members offer their support through their membership only—and many have said they wish they were able to do more. But we know that their financial help through membership is vital to the organization. Others lend physical help as they put up/take down displays, work shifts at the various venues, read stories at a festival to entice the children to love books and reading, tally up volunteer hours working at the library, or speak at various civic organizations about what FOUCL is involved in, thereby garnering additional memberships. This past year, presentations were given at Kiwanis, Rotary and at the Parent's Night at the Union County Elementary School. And from the contact made last year at the Kappa Alpha Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi, we receive continuing support through their annual giving program. It is this cooperative community-wide spirit that continues to allow FOUCL to do all the things we do to make the Library bastion of the community.

We are also fortunate to have as a special Friends' member **Teresa Moore**, who when she's not working at United Community Bank, serves as chairman of the Staff Appreciation Committee, bringing monthly baskets of

goodies, helping to celebrate staff birthdays, anniversaries and holidays.

Looking back on how FOUCL was able to impact the Library—and in turn the community at large this past year, there was an impressive number of things to take into account: we provided subscriptions for 33 magazines and six newspapers; purchased 150 books; bought two Early Learning Computers as well as a rug and furnishings for the new Children's area; contributed \$4,400 towards the cost of new handicap accessible doors; set aside funds for a scanner; and await further word from Librarian Susie Brendle as to what additional items are needed now that the library has expanded from 6,000 square feet to over 13,000 square feet.

Our Thanks-Giving List includes generous donors, like those who purchased a tent for the festivals we participate in, or paid for the Celebration Cake for the 15th Anniversary party, or made a donation to cover the cost of the BBQ. Most of the new shelving is in place. Because there were a few unforeseen delays and some shelving was wrong again, we had to reorder shelving items in the youth room and the magazine area. We hope all of the shelving will be completed before Thanksgiving. While we were closed for new shelving, we also had handicapped accessibility doors installed on the front entrance. They've already been utilized by many grateful patrons. A huge thank you to the Friends for agreeing to pay half of the cost. Other new features include new track lighting installed in the magazine and new book area and new window treatments throughout the library, hung by Marcie Culpepper.

Our attendance and circulation remain extremely high even though we're

well past our summer peak. The Monday we reopened after the shelving installation brought 936 patrons through the door. People from around the state are coming to see us. We have a lot to be proud of with our beloved library.
