Library grant gets lawmakers approval

Funds will help with expansion project

Union County Library iust received notification that its request for a grant has been approved in the Legislature and is pending approval of the Governor. The Grant is in the amount of \$1,665,000 dollars.

In addition the County is contributing \$900,000 in matching funds from the recently passed SPLOST which makes the total funding available \$2.565 million dollars.

Both Sen. Chip Pearson and Rep. Steve Allison worked together with local officials Commissioner Lamar Paris, Mountain Regional Library Director Donna Howell, UC Librarian Susie Brendle, Friends of the Library and many, many individuals to make this a possibility.

Commissioner Paris said "I am thrilled and overwhelmed that the Legislators, Friends of the Library and the State Library Board were able to strongly advocate for this funding and the results of their hard work is evident.

It is also important to note that the citizens of Union County worked for and voted for the approval of the latest SPLOST funding. Without matching funds, the process wouldn't get off the ground."

The funding will be used to construct and renovate the Union County Library, a program that has been on the needs to be done list for several vears.

As of March 15, 2009 we have 65 active memberships. Last year we ended with more than 200 members.


Our membership year runs from January 1- December 31. If you are one of "forgetful" friends, please renew your membership today.

Thank you to Steve and JoAnne Olson and all of the other volunteers that are working so hard on these events.



Bass tournament fundraiser April 18

The Friends of Union County Library will sponsor the second annual Benefit Bass Tournament April 18, 2009. The event will be launched from the Deavertown Boat ramp at 7:30 a.m. and concluding with the weigh-in at 2 p.m.. Signup will kick off at 7:00 a.m.. A drawing for starting positions may be necessary depending on number of participating boats. The tournament will be rain or shine.

Entry fees will be \$25 per person, maximum two people per boat.

The payouts will total 50% of entries and will be made for the first three places. Tournament rules include a five fish limit of smallmouth, largemouth or spotted bass twelve inches in length or longer. Additionally, only artificial baits allowed, winners will be determined by total weight of catch. Participants under 12 years of age fish free.
