A BUSY SUMMER

Summertime has been a very busy time for Union County Public Library. We've had record numbers of patrons and circulation. Here are a few of the high numbers that we've had for the month of June: three days of over 500 patrons visiting the library, 10 days of over 400 patrons and 5 days of over 300. We've issued around 100 new library cards; we've had over 150 out-of-town guests log on to our public access computers; and we've had over 70 people use our wireless access with their laptops.

We are very excited that the \$2 million for library materials has been added to the State budget. This will mean an additional \$18,000.00 will be in the Mountain Regional Library System book budget annually. Please thank your state legislators for helping pass this much-needed and appreciated part of the State budget.

VACATION READING PROGRAM



We've had an exciting Vacation Reading Program this summer. We kicked off the program at our Monday morning story time on June 4, 2007 with a special visit from Smokey the Bear and Union County Commissioner Lamar Paris who have both been strong supporters of the library and our children's programs. Our Vacation Reading Program

theme is "Reading Takes You Everywhere" and we've made the Appalachian Trail the focus this year. If you haven't been by the library since the first of June to see how the children's area has been turned into a forest with trees, tent and animals please come by and check it out. The United States Forest Service, especially the Chattahoochee and Oconee National Forest division, has been a HUGE contributor to our forest area for the children. They donated maps, posters and important information about the Appalachian trail and the local forest to help us prepare the area. They also loaned us a stuffed 18-month-old black bear for display. They use the bear to help educate children about black bears and their habitat. A special thanks to Mike Davis and Joy Kajan for all their hard work helping us create our forest.

LIBRARY EXPANSION!!

Donna Howell, Director of the Mountain Regional Library System, and I met with Commissioner Lamar Paris in June about the budget and expansion of the library. We were informed that we will be on the 2009 SPLOST and Commissioner Paris is ready to get started on



renovations and expansion. We're meeting with architects and are going full speed ahead on library expansion. The SPLOST will help us expand and renovate areas that are starting to run down in the library and possibly go up with another floor; but there will still be much need for fundraising to help pay for furnishings and decorating. The Friends of Union County Public Library will play a valuable role in helping raise these funds and promoting awareness of the project to the community and to our local and state officials. Donna and I will be turning to all of you a lot in the next couple years for your help and advocacy. I'm very excited about this expansion as I'm sure you are as well. I love our library as do my children and helping it grow and become a vital part of the community is my greatest goal. I will be eager to hear any suggestions you might have for the expansion and hope to start a journal of suggestions that I can have to present to architects and planners. More information about the expansion will follow in future newsletters as I have the information myself. We are in the beginning stages right now so much of the plans are still not known to Donna or me; but we will inform as we know.

If you get a chance to speak with Commissioner Lamar Paris please give him a HUGE "Thank you!" for approving our FY2008 budget and the expansion of the library project.
