Susie Says... from our Librarian, Susie Brendle



Thank you to all of the Friends of Union County Public Library for your continued support. Your support helps the library be the wonderful place that it is for our beautiful community.

The cleaning service that we hired this fall is working great. B.L. and Norma Jean Anderson from Appalachian Cleaning Services do a great job. FOL gave the library enough to pay almost half

of their salary for this year which is a great help.



We received six new public access computers on January 2nd as part of the Bill and Melinda Gates Grant. That puts our total public access computers up

to fourteen. If you recall, the Friends of Union County Public Library gave Mountain Regional Library System money to pay toward wireless access for these computers.

Along with the new computers, we began two new programs to help with the management of the public access computers. One program is PC Reservations. PC Reservations allows patrons to walk into the library and go to any of the public access computers and begin their session without stopping at the front desk to "check out" a computer. There are a few important things to remember with PC Reservations, though.


- 1) You must have your library card AND your pin number to log on to the computer. If you don't know or remember your pin number please stop at the front desk with your library card and a staff member can reset your number for you. We can not give that number to you over the telephone though and we can not give that number to anyone but the person who "owns" the card.
- 2) Your library card is good for only one

computer at a time. A family can not use the same card to check out multiple computers. "One card-one computer."

3) PLEASE hold on to your pin number. We can reset the number a few times for you if you misplace it but we can not continue to do so over and over. That defeats the purposes of easy access for patrons and easier service for staff.

Another program is LPT: Print One Management. This program helps manage print jobs at the public access computers. Instead of copies printing immediately when a patron sends a print job to the printer, it first tells the patron how many copies the job will be and the cost BEFORE the job is sent so the patron can cancel without wasting money if they accidentally printed the wrong thing. After the patron okays the job it is sent to a print management computer behind the circulation desk and a staff member releases the job to the printer AFTER the patron pays for the copies. This will help save tons of wasted paper.

On a similar note, because toner and paper prices have increased a lot in the last few years, Union County Public Library—and the rest of the Mountain Regional Library system—have had to increase the



price for copies on both the copy machines and the computer printers. Those increases are: Letter size 15 cents, Legal size 20 cents and Ledger size 30 cents.



As with any part of the library, if you have questions about the two new computer programs please stop by the front desk and we will be happy to walk you through them.

Join in the fun—it just won't be complete without you!


