Architect selected for library project

Renovation & Expansion to begin soon

We've had an extremely busy, hugely successful Fall at Union County Public Library. Starting in August and continuing through October, several of the members of our library building committee visited a total of 6 different libraries to look at examples of certain architects' work.

We gained a lot of great ideas and also got some advice from librarians about what worked or didn't work for them.

After looking over the different architectural styles, talking with the architects and having them submit bids, we have chosen Jack Bailey from Bailey and Associates of Gainesville, Georgia to design the plans for our renovation/expansion project.

The following members of our Building Committee visited libraries with us: Linda Roberson, Barbara Hale, Ed Reed, Mitch Griggs and Peggy Deyton.

Bio of architect Jack Bailey

Jack Bailey received a Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1960 from Georgia Tech and later studied in Fontainebleau, France. He served two years in the U. S. Air Force before starting his career as an architect in Knoxville, Tennessee. He has worked in the Gainesville and Atlanta areas as since 1965. The current Bailey & Associates began in 1983 and is a highly respected architectural firm located on Green Street in Gainesville, Georgia.

Some of the projects they worked on are: North Georgia Regional Library in Clarkesville; Brenau University Library in Gainesville; Hall County Libraries in Gainesville, East Hall and Murrayville; Rabun County Library in Clayton; The *Times* Newspaper in Gainesville; and Agnes Scott College Inman Hall Restoration in Decatur. Also accompanying us on the trip were Director Donna Howell, Technology Librarian Peter Johnson, Building Consultant Joe Foresee and Library Assistant Barry Massey.

A newly formed Design Sub-Committee will soon get started consulting with Mr. Bailey about design and decor. That sub-committee includes Building Committee members Teresa Moore and Barbara Hale and Library Assistant Barry Massey.

In January, Donna and I will have more information available about the State Grant for our renovation project We will also have more information on where we are with architectural plans and what lies ahead for us toward Summer 2009.
