What Impact Do We Have On Our Library?

According to Donna Howell, Mountain Regional Library Director, State funding for library materials has been reduced from 56ϕ per full time resident to 21ϕ and is expected to be lowered even more, which makes FRIENDS more important than ever!

In 2009, FOUCL provided funds for:


- 201 Adult and Juvenile Books

- And many other miscellaneous expenses
